Dante F. Gallerani

Dante F. Gallerani of Sagamore, 95, a lifelong resident of Bourne, died at home on May 4 after a six-year battle with dementia.

He was the husband of Mary Jane Gallerani, to whom he was married for 55 years.

Born in Monument Beach, he was the only son of Rinaldo and Romilda Gallerani. He was raised in Sagamore and attended Bourne schools. In 1932, when he was 16, his education was halted by the death of his mother.

He worked on the construction of the Sagamore Bridge and went inside the abutments to tie the steel rods.

At age 20, he left home to work for the Atlantic, Pacific and Gulf Company on dredge boats. He became a tugboat operator and spent two years plying the waters around Bermuda.

Mr. Gallerani enlisted in the Navy in 1943 and became a Navy Seabee (CBMU 569) and served in the Pacific, primarily on Treasury Island and in the Philippines.

Upon his discharge in 1946, he went to work for Cape Cod Shipbuilding Co. in Wareham, where he became a pioneer in the fiberglass boat-building industry. He perfected his own formulas through trial and error and was the superintendent of fiberglass construction for two decades.

In the mid-1960s, after an industrial accident, he was diagnosed with Paget's disease and dealt with its debilitating effects throughout his life. He obtained his real estate broker's license in 1966 and operated his own real estate office for 39 years. He was active in the Cape Cod Board of Realtors and served on several committees. He was one of the first mediators appointed by the board. He held the GRI and CRS designations.

Mr. Gallerani was a lifelong parishioner of Corpus Christi Church and served at St. Theresa's Church in Sagamore as an usher and bell ringer. He was the recipient of the Marian Medal from the Diocese of Fall River in 2002.

He was predeceased by his parents and two sisters, Lucy Yundt

and Mary LeClair.

In addition to his wife, he leaves his daughters, Susan Amodeo-Cathey and Helen Lovell; and three grandchildren, Jeffrey Amodeo, Matthew Amodeo and Alicia Amodeo.

A funeral Mass was celebrated at Corpus Christi Church yesterday. Burial followed at St. Peter's Cemetery.

Carol Olson

Carol (Clarke) Olson, 70, of Monument Beach died on May 7 after a battle with cancer.

She was the wife of Laurence H. Olson, to whom she was married for nearly 52 years.

Born in Melrose, she was the daughter of the late Earle S. and Alberta (Berninger) Clarke. She graduated from Stoneham High School in 1959 and attended Fisher Junior College.

On June 11, 1960, she married Laurence Olson. They raised their family in Stoneham and then Melrose, until retiring to Monument Beach in 2002.

Ms. Olson was a member of the First Baptist Church of Stoneham for 60 years. For many years, she used her gift of music, serving as organist and choir director at the First Baptist Church; she continued using her musical talents serving as organist and choir director at Swift Memorial United Methodist Church in Sagamore Beach for seven years. She taught piano to many students for 35 years. She had been a Bible study leader and a member and chairman of the Cape Cod Christian Women's Club.

For nine years, she and her husband volunteered for Meals on Wheels.

In addition to her husband, she leaves six children, Glenn Olson of Rutland, Vermont, Lynda Fields of Stoneham, Karen Karoghlianian of Fallston, Maryland, James Olson of Stoneham, Paul Olson of Woburn and John Olson of Cambridge. She also leaves 17 grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; a sister, Elea-

nor Flowers of Beverly; and many nieces and nephews.

A funeral service celebrating her life was to be held at noon today in the First Baptist Church in Stoneham.

A memorial service will be held at Swift Memorial United Methodist Church in Sagamore Beach at a later date.

Ruth Nebiker Rice of Buzzards Bay died on March 23 at the age of 80.

Mrs. Rice grew up in a music family and loved teaching from her first years in Bourne to her retirement 32 years later in Longmeadow.

Music, both teaching students and her own vocal performances, was an integral part of her life.

Born in Boston to T. Robert and Marie Nebiker, she was educated at Girls Latin School and received a BS in education from State Teacher's College in Boston. Her love of music started early; as a teenager she was awarded opportunities to sing with renowned composer E. Power Biggs and with the Worcester, Hartford and New Bedford Symphony choruses. She was the alto soloist for 20 years at First Church of Christ in Longmeadow and then at Bourne United Methodist Church after moving to Buzzards Bay in 1994.

She met Thomas Rice on Cape Cod while teaching 4th grade in Bourne in 1953, while on a blind date. They wed in June 1957 and were married for 50 years at the time of his death. During their marriage, her husband's position with Friendly Ice Cream took them to many spots around southern New England. She finally retired from teaching after 22 years at Williams Middle School in Longmeadow.

Since moving to the Cape, she had been a devoted volunteer and member of the Bourne United Methodist Church.

She leaves her son, Robert Rice of Tallahassee, Florida; and three grandchildren, Justin Kyle Rice, Matthew Thomas Rice and Meghan Christine Rice. She also leaves her niece, Earlene M. Bowen of Florida.

In addition to her husband, she was predeceased by her daughter, Christine Rice.

A service celebrating her life is being held Saturday at the Bourne United Methodist Church at 11 AM.

She was cremated and her ashes were interred with her husband's at the Massachusetts National Cemetery in Bourne on April 2.

Regina A. Jason

Regina (Andraschko) Jason, 88, a longtime resident of Provincetown who leaves family in Bourne, died on May 5 after a long struggle with Alzheimer's.

She was the wife of Reginald F. Jason. They would have celebrated their 69th wedding anniversary in June.

Rabies Clinic To Help Raise Funds For Police Dog Protective Vests

Sandra L. Marcal said it was the power of filmmaking that led her to her life's pursuit. The animal lover from East Taunton said that the 2003 cable TV movie "Rain" had a deeply emotional impact on her. The plot of the movie focused on a German shepherd named Rain that had been trained to fight in the Vietnam War, and the bond that developed between the dog and an American officer. In the end, however, the officer has to leave the dog behind when he returns to America.

"The dog was fighting for our country and not given an opportunity to come home," Ms. Marcal lamented. She said she was also affected by the dog not having any body armor when he went into battle.

After watching the movie, Ms. Marcal also learned that just like military dogs, police dogs are also put into dangerous situations without any kind of protective armor. Soon after, she founded Vested Interest in K-9s, a nonprofit, all-volunteer charity in East Taunton. Ms. Marcal started the organization in 2009, which she now runs along with Robert H. Fennessey Jr., an attorney in Walpole, and Sarah Glaser, an editor for GateHouse Media. The charity's website revealed that Mr. Fennessey teaches a course in animal law and rights at the University of Massachusetts Law School in Dartmouth, and Ms. Glaser volunteers for several animal rescue organizations.

The nonprofit's mission is to provide bullet- and stab-proof vests for law enforcement dogs in Massachusetts and throughout the United States.

"Our home state is Massachusetts, but as funds permit, we will help dogs outside the state, too," she explained. In addition to Massachusetts, protective vests bought by Vested Interest in K9s have gone to police dogs in Connecticut, New Hampshire, Florida, California, Hawaii, Tennessee, Illinois, Missouri, and North Dakota.

To date, the charity has provided 95 vests to dogs across the country. Their website said that through private and corporate sponsorships, they provided 64 police dogs with protective vests just last year.

Vested Interest in K9s will hold a fundraising rabies clinic on Sunday, May 20, from 1 PM to 4 PM, at the All Pets Medical Center, 16 Waterhouse Road in Bourne. People can bring in their dog or cat to receive a rabies vaccination. The cost of the vaccination is \$10 and the money will go toward purchasing life-saving bullet- and stab-proof vests for police dogs throughout

the country. "The need is greater than people think," Ms. Marcal said recently over the phone. "There's not just a chance they'll get shot, but that they'll also get stabbed," she said. She mentioned the case of a dog named Kilo in Florida, who is profiled on the charity's website. Kilo was shot three times at close range, but survived, thanks to the protective vest he was wearing. Ms. Marcal said Kilo's vest was not bought with funds raised by Vested Interest in K9s, but the Hernando County Sheriff's Office allowed her to use his story to point out the reality of the dangers dogs face.

"To show that this is what is happening and that dogs need these vests," she said.

The dogs must be leashed, and cats must be in carriers at the rabies clinic. All pets must be at least 12 weeks old to be vaccinated. A three-year rabies shot is available if a pet's current rabies certificate is presented. Massachusetts law requires that all dogs and cats be vaccinated against rabies.

Each vest costs \$1,006 and has a five-year warranty. They are made by Protective Products Enterprises in Sunrise, Florida, and ordered through Regency Police Supply in Hyannis. Regency Police Supply also does custom embroidery on the body armor.

"Embroidery is significant," Ms. Marcal explained. She said that some people have the name of a deceased loved one or pet embroidered on a vest. Corporations have even put their corporate logo on a vest "in memory of a lost employee," she said.
